### Plant Tour to Collano Ebnöther

Collano would like to take visitors on a most unusual plant tour on which they can be convinced that nature and chemical production can prosper together.

In 1997, on the occasion of the 50th anniversary, Collano launched the so-called 'Collano Trail', after realising that an industrial area provides a biotope in its own right. In places not affected by daily production activities a wealth of plant, small animal and bird life had developed over the years. Additionally, Collano fostered new biospheres by deliberately replanting rare species which seem to find their new neighbourhood rather attractive.

The Collano Trail guides the visitor through this unique piece of nature as well as through production units thereby offering entertainment and adventure at the same time. This morning event will be concluded by a lunch at a Swiss dairy farm.
